Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Sierra Forest Products, Inc 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Sierra Forest Products, Inc 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Sierra Forest Products, Inc. (the Employer) who have completed 12 months of service and are at least 21 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). Fidelity Management Trust Company and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company are the Plan's Trustee and Insurer, respectively.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was restated, and Fidelity Management Trust Company was appointed as the new Trustee and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company was released as the Plan's Insurer. Plan assets transferred to Fidelity Management Trust Company were allocated into funds comparable to those offered by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The conversion initiated a blackout period beginning December 24, 2024, and continued through January 31, 2025. During this period, funds could not be applied to the employee-selected funds with Fidelity Management Trust Company or withdrawn from the Plan until the conversion was completed. During this period, employee contributions continued to be withheld through payroll deductions and were deposited into the Plan and allocated into the employee-selected funds at the conclusion of the blackout period.

Contributions

From January 1 to June 10, participants were permitted to contribute up to 100 percent of annual compensation as pretax or Roth deferrals, as defined in the Plan and subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Effective June 11, 2025, the Plan was amended to reduce the maximum permitted participant contribution amount to 80 percent of annual compensation and permit employee after-tax contributions up to 10 percent of annual compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover contributions). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant.

The Employer may make additional discretionary matching or nonelective contributions. The Employer made discretionary matching contributions of 100 percent of the first 3 percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2025, the Employer made total contributions of \$559,656.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Employer's contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant vests 20 percent after two years of service, and an additional 20 percent each year thereafter until they become 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate on all outstanding loans ranged from 4.25 to 9.50 percent. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, death, disability, attainment of age 59 ½ or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive the vested balance in the participant's account in a lump sum, or it may be rolled into a different individual retirement account. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59 ½. The Employer is permitted to involuntarily cash-out and rollover terminated participant account balances from the Plan and into an individual retirement account if they are \$7,000 or less.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2025 and 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$90,118 and \$22,376, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay for plan expenses. For the 2025 year ended, forfeited nonvested accounts were used to pay for plan expenses of \$12,500.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by the Plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of the Plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee and Insurer. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan agreement.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses incurred by maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Due to Broker Payable

Amounts payable to Fidelity Management Trust Company for investment assets of the Plan related to contributions for the 2026 plan year were recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through May 18, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation methodology include: • quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; • quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; • inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; • inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts: Valued at NAV as a practical expedient and reported by the issuer. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of a variety of underlying assets owned by the common/collective trust, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The investment objectives and underlying investments of the common/collective trusts can vary with some geared towards capital preservation, target retirement dates, bond indices, international equity, and domestic equity. Common/collective trusts held by the Plan may be redeemed at NAV daily without restriction.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at NAV of units held by the Plan as a practical expedient and reported by the Insurer. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the pooled separate account, which are typically mutual funds or other marketable securities, less its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV of pooled separate accounts are not

publicly quoted in an active market. Pooled separate accounts held by the Plan may be redeemed at NAV daily without restriction.

At December 31, 2024, all the Plan's investments measured at fair value have been valued using the NAV practical expedient, or its equivalent, and therefore have not been classified and reported within the fair value hierarchy.

4. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

5. Certified Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants presented in the financial statements, accompanying notes to the financial statements, and supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) was certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the Trustee and Insurer of the Plan, respectively. As permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the plan administrator has instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform auditing procedures with respect to the certified information, except for comparing such information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

The information certified by the Trustee includes the balances of investments held and notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2025, and related investment earnings and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2025. The information certified by the Insurer includes the balances of investments held as of December 31, 2024.

6. Group Annuity Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with the Insurer totaling \$303,383 for 2024. The Insurer maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate was based on a formula established by the contract issuer and was reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Insurer, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) the premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

7. Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

9. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee and Insurer of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.
