Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Frasier Meadows Manor, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

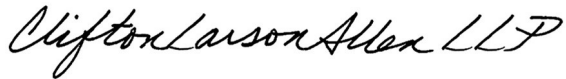

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Frasier Meadows Manor, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Frasier Meadows Manor, Inc. (the Employer) on the first pay date of the month coincident with or next following the completion of six months of employment with the Employer and upon turning 21 years of age. Effective July 1, 2024, employees are eligible after the completion of one month of employment and upon turning 21 years of age. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a percentage, limited by Plan provisions, of their eligible compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) contributions to the Plan. Effective July 1, 2024, Roth deferrals are permitted. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan after reaching eligibility requirements. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation, and their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant. The automatic elective deferral contribution shall increase by 1% on or after each subsequent yearly date on January 1 up to a maximum of 10% of pay. Effective July 1, 2024, the maximum increased to 20%. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Employer makes a matching contribution to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Employer matching contribution for eligible employees was 100% up to 5% eligible annual compensation deferred that a participant contributes to the Plan.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's matching contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer matching contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of vesting service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of vesting service. Notwithstanding the above, a participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution or installments. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000 (\$7,000 as of July 1, 2024), the Plan Sponsor may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½, qualified reservist distribution, and hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from participants and Employer matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefits paid to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through June 26, 2026, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Principal Trust Employer, the qualified institution of the Plan, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of investments and notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, and investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2025, in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
or
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2025 and 2024.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Valued at the NAV of units as determined by the insurance Employer. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

Common Collective Trusts – Valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

NOTE 5 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Employer has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by the qualified institution of the Plan; therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. In addition, the Plan provides for notes receivables from participants. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 9 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

The Employer failed to remit employee 401(k) deferral contributions for certain payroll periods during 2024 within the time frame prescribed by the Department of Labor. These are deemed prohibited transactions in accordance with ERISA and the IRC. The Employer corrected the 2024 prohibited transactions by depositing lost earnings.
