Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Incentive Profit Sharing Plan for Employees of Sealing Devices Inc. (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended September 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of September 30, 2025 and 2024, and for the year ended September 30, 2025 stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

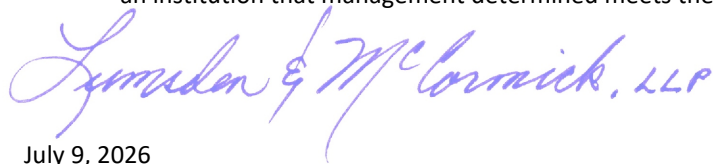

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan:

The following description of Incentive Profit Sharing Plan for Employees of Sealing Devices Inc. (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Sealing Devices Inc. (the Company). It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company may make profit sharing contributions at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, earnings and allocations of the Company's contribution, less allowable expenses. The benefit to which an employee is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the employee's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service, as defined. Employer contributions vest over a six-year period.

Investment Options:

A participant may direct contributions into a variety of investments offered by AdvisorTrust, Inc. All profit sharing contributions made by the Company are invested in a portfolio of investments as directed by the Company (until the later of the participant's 50th birthday or the participant becomes 100% vested).

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their 401(k) deferral accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 minus the highest outstanding balance of loans in the past 12 months or 50 percent of their account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence, in which case, the repayment period may exceed five years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably generally through weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant usually receives a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Forfeited Accounts:

At September 30, 2025 and 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$68,631 and \$93,017. These accounts may be used in a variety of manners. In 2025, \$93,746 of forfeited nonvested amounts were used to reduce employer contributions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Inputs to the valuation methodology for mutual funds and the cash and cash equivalents are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Unrealized appreciation or depreciation on investments is charged or credited to the net assets of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses:

At the discretion of the Plan Administrator, the majority of administrative expenses have been borne by the Plan.

Subsequent Events:

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through July 9, 2026 (the date the financial statements were available to be issued).

3. Financial Information Certified by the Trustee:

In accordance with Department of Labor Regulation 2520.103-8, the Plan Administrator has obtained certified "Statements of Account" from AdvisorTrust, Inc. as of and for the years ended September 30, 2025 and 2024 that the information below is complete and accurate:

5. Plan Termination:

The Internal Revenue Service has issued a favorable opinion letter regarding the tax-exempt status of the Plan. Accordingly, no provision has been made for income taxes.

7. Risks and Uncertainties:

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investments are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in investment values will occur in the near term and could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
