Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Hirschi Companies 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Hirschi Companies 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2025 and 2024, and for the year ended December 31, 2025, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Hirschi Companies 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Hirschi Companies 401(K) Plan (the Plan) provides general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Hirschi Companies, LLC (the Company) established the Hirschi Companies 401(k) Plan as a defined contribution retirement plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan was formerly named the Hirschi Masonry, LLC 401(k) Plan which was previously sponsored by Hirschi Masonry, LLC an affiliate of Hirschi Companies, LLC. The Plan has an effective date of January 1, 2016. The Plan agreement was written to comply with the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and the provisions of the Tax Reform Act of 1986 and may, from time to time, be amended and restated to comply with various changes in legislation and regulation. The Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to become participants in the Plan the first of the month following their first six calendar months of service. One month of service is defined as an employee working one hour of one day during a month. The Plan has a minimum age requirement of 21 years.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the lower of 100% of their annual salary or the maximum amount allowable by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans as rollover contributions to the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company contributes to the Plan under the Safe Harbor provisions of the IRC. These matching contributions are based on the amount contributed to the Plan by the Participants. If Participants contribute 3% or less of their compensation, the Company will make a safe harbor matching contribution of 100% of these contributions. If Participants contribute more than 3% but not more than 5% of their compensation, the Company will also make a safe harbor matching contribution of 50% of these contributions. The safe harbor contributions made by the Company to the Plan are fully vested immediately and cannot be forfeited. For the year ending December 31, 2025, the Company made Safe Harbor matching contributions of \$227,996.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) Plan earnings, and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participants vested account.

Vesting of Benefits

Participants are immediately vested in their elective contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary matching portion of their account is based on years of continuous service, where a participant is generally 100% vested after five years of credited service. Employer Safe Harbor contributions are fully vested and non-forfeitable for contributions made beginning January 1, 2018. Each participant's benefits are limited to the balance in the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rates are determined by the Plan Administrator based on prevailing market rates, as defined by the Plan. The terms of the loan shall not exceed five years unless the purpose of the loan is for the purchase of the participant's primary residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2025 or 2024. In the event of participant default through nonpayment or other means, foreclosure on the promissory note and attachment of security may not occur until an event occurs that would allow or require a distribution of a participant's vested account balance.

Distribution of Benefits

Participants or their beneficiaries may begin receiving benefits upon termination of the participant's employment for any reason, including death or disability. Distributions may be made as a single lump, installments over a period of not more than the participant or their beneficiaries assumed life expectancy, partial withdrawals, or as a direct rollover to a qualifying institution. If none of those options are elected by the participant or their beneficiary, and the vested account balance is less than \$5,000, the Company may, at its discretion, distribute the account directly to the participant in the form of a lump sum payment. If the vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, the participant or their eligible beneficiary must consent to receive any distributions from their account. Under certain circumstances permitted by the Plan, prior to termination, employees may receive hardship or in-service distributions for part or all of their vested account balance.

Forfeited Amounts

At December 31, 2025 and 2024, unused forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$8,774 and \$6,690, respectively. Forfeitures that are attributable to employer matching and discretionary contributions may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or reduce future employer contributions payable under the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2025, no forfeited non-vested funds were used for these purposes.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Quoted market prices are used to value investments. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and the custodian of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the DOL. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 4 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5 – PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION

Although the Company has established the Plan with the bona fide intention and expectation that it will be maintained indefinitely; nevertheless, the Plan Sponsor is not under any obligation or liability to continue the Plan for any given length of time. The Plan Sponsor may in its sole discretion discontinue or terminate the Plan in whole or in part in accordance with its provisions at any time without any liability for such discontinuance or termination.

In the event the Plan terminates, no further contributions will be made to the Plan and all amounts credited to the participants' accounts will become 100% vested in accordance with the Plan. The Plan Sponsor will direct the distribution of participants' accounts in a manner permitted by the Plan as soon as practicable.

NOTE 6 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN (UNAUDITED)

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2025 and 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2025, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE 7 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the recordkeeper of the Plan; or their affiliates, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Direct fees paid by the Plan to these parties amounted to \$4,540 and \$5,561 for the year ended December 31, 2025 and 2024.

NOTE 8 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan offers investments in a Fixed Income Account, which is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract issued by Voya Retirement and Insurance Annuity Company ("VRIAC"), the custodian, with the backing of their general account. As it is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in fair value of underlying assets, this type of investment is considered fairly valued at contract value. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is defined in the contract. VRIAC guarantees that interest will be credited at the higher of a rate guaranteed in the group annuity contract and the current rate declared by it.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. The Plan may transact according to the terms defined in the contract at any time.

Certain events might limit the availability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Examples of such events include the Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC); premature termination of the contract; Plan termination or merger; changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options; or bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines; a breach of material obligation under the contract; a material misrepresentation; or a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 9 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation method include: • quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; • quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; • inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; • inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
